





WOLLONDILLY **YOUTH VOICES PROJECT**





Wollondilly Youth Voices Project is about supporting the recovery of local children and young people after the Green Wattle Creek Bushfire, giving them the opportunity to have fun, meet new people and share their stories and experiences. The initiative is funded by the Rotary Club of Wollondilly North.

Youth Voices are free workshops which will be held at Cataract Scout Park in Appin. The workshops will involve fun outdoor activities such as archery and an obstacle course and interactive sessions with the NSW Rural Fire Service. Short Black Films will be present at the event to record footage and interviews which will be edited into a short film.

Participants will be invited to share their stories of the Green Wattle Creek bushfires and their views on how their community is recovering from the bushfires and provide insight into how council and commun services can meet their needs. Child and youth psychologists will be present at the workshops.


